To have a residency at your school, the lead teacher(s) must attend our Professional Learning Workshop and Orientation Day on Friday, November 3, 2023 from 9am-3pm.

The **A** **B** **C** ^S of the series:

- SERIES A** Attend 4 performances, and have 2 residencies (8 TA classes) \$32 per student.
- SERIES B** Attend 2 performances, and have 1 residency (4 TA classes) \$18 per student
- SERIES C** Attend 1 performance, and have 1 residency (4 TA classes) \$10 per student
- SERIES D** Attend 1 performance, and have 1 residency (8 TA classes) \$16 per student
- SERIES E** Attend any performance. No TA classes. \$8 per student
